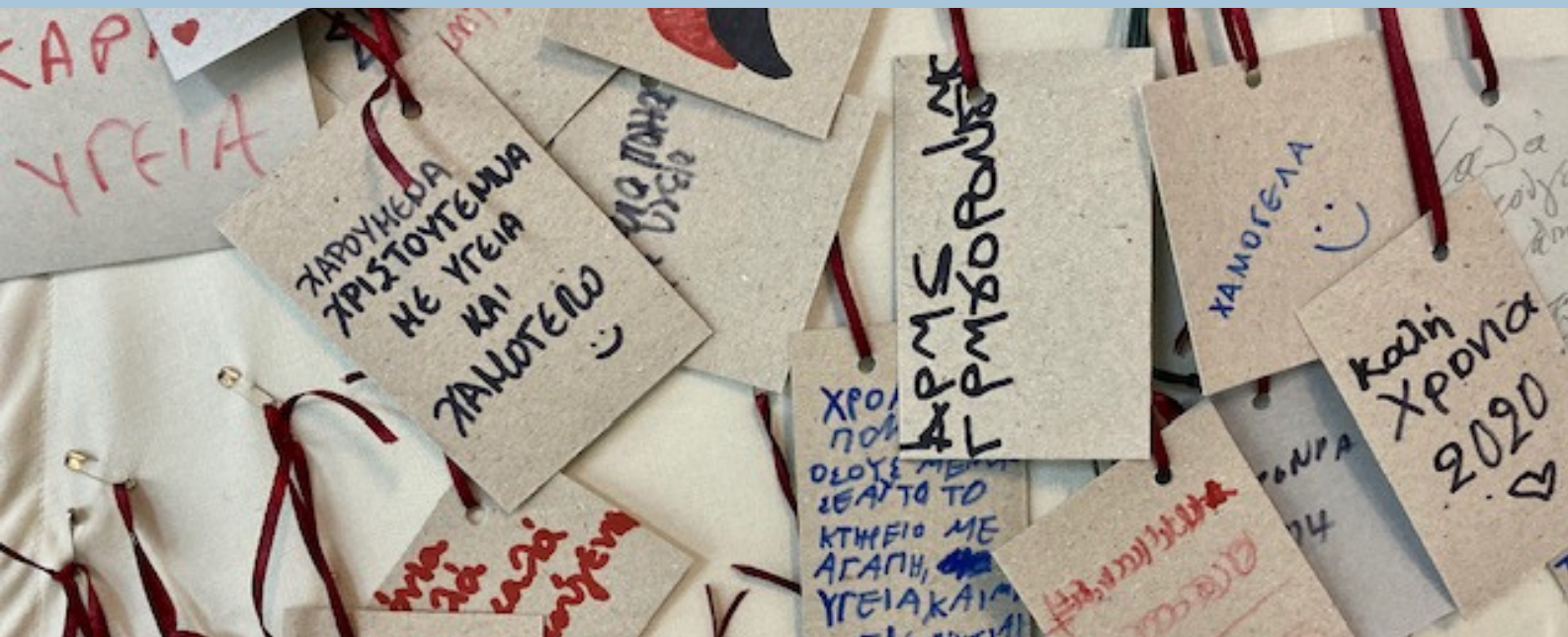


iRoDi Festival

5o iRoDi Festival

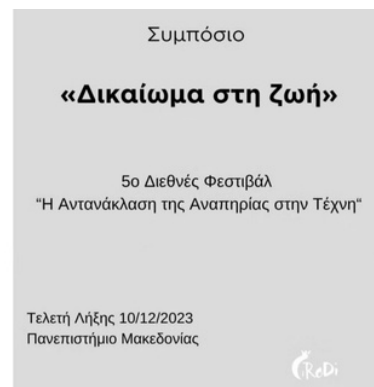
The atmosphere was very emotional at the live opening ceremony of the 5th International Festival "Reflection of Disability in Art" of the University of Macedonia.

INCLUSIVE ARTISTIC GROUPS

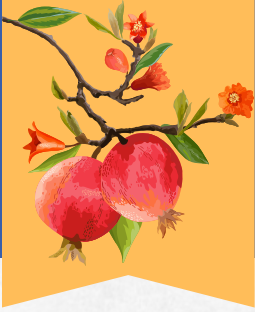

On the 13th of September 2023 the "Reflection of Disability in Art" International Festival, the volunteer group "MOUS.E.S." and the inclusive group "The Protagonists" held an art and craft workshop for children ages 4 to 12 years old at the International Exhibition of Thessaloniki - TIF, supported by EPTTA - Welfare, Culture, Art, Tourism, and Disability.





TRAINING VOLUNTEERS

An online training for our volunteers was conducted on the 20th of July 2023. The topic was "Sexual Education and Abuse", and it was instructed by Mrs. Kalliopi Hainoglou, Assistant Professor of the Department of International and European Studies and Substitute Member of the Gender Equality Committee of the University of Macedonia. All in all, everyone must remember that abuse comes in many forms that can change and/or worsen. Additionally, the lack of welfare and prevention in Greece was highlighted, as well as the need for permanent personnel in Special education settings, mainly social workers and psychologists. During the discussion, the volunteers asked questions and referenced their personal experiences from schools and institutions of special education.



On September 7th, 2023, another online volunteer training was held. This time, the discussion theme was "Disability and Cinema". The training was issued by the Head of the Festival Ms. Lefkothea Kartasidou, Professor of the Department of Educational and Social Policy and Substitute Member of the Gender Equality Committee of the University of Macedonia. Some of the topics that were discussed are the absence or existence of disabled people in films, how is a disabled character depicted, good and bad representation practices, underlying meanings that devalue disabled people, the general aesthetic of films/documentaries, etc.



With the 5th iRoDi Festival around the corner, a training was held on the 18th of September 2023. The topic was the "Basic Principles of Volunteering - MOUS.E.S.", to inform the newcomer volunteers about the good practices of the Festival. All volunteers (former and novice) participated in the training that took place at the gym of the University of Macedonia. The Festival's Head, Mrs. Lefkothea Kartasidou, conducted the training.
